# FeNO Coding Guidance for Primary Care - SNOMED CODES

The following NHS Digital SNOMED Clinical Term (CT) codes have been identified to support the clinical coding of FeNO testing in primary care.

- 444642008 Measurement of expired NO (procedural code)
- 405626009 Respired NO monitoring
- 397880004 Respired NO concentration
- 1484910000 FeNO test service not available

## **FeNO Testing Templates for Clinical Systems**

Ardens has created a FeNO Testing template to assist with the recording of the FeNO test procedure and results, and referrals made. These are available free of charge to all EMIS and TPP users, regardless of whether a user is an existing Ardens customer or not (Made available via the national FeNO programme). If the practice is not already using Ardens then: You need to join the free Ardens Open Access Group to access — via this link
