FeNO Coding Guidance for Primary Care – [SNOMED CODES](#)

The following NHS Digital SNOMED Clinical Term (CT) codes have been identified to support the clinical coding of FeNO testing in primary care.

- 444642008 – Measurement of expired NO (procedural code)
- 405626009 – Respired NO monitoring
- 397880004 – Respired NO concentration
- 1484910000 – FeNO test service not available

FeNO Testing Templates for Clinical Systems
